During the academic session 2022-23, the University provided the scholarship to the students with worth Rs 9986599 in the form of fee waiver. The University implements U.P. Govt. Post-Matric Scholarship to SC/ST/OBC/Minority &Economically weak students as per the norms laid down by the State/ Central Govt. Similarly, the University accepts scholarship of other states as well and provides full support to the students regarding the documentation process for the same. The University also allows socially disadvantageous students to pay fee in Installments. The students also apply for scholarship on National Scholarship Portal. Meritorious scholarship of 10% Fee Concessions is given to Girl Students under 'Beti Bachao Beti Padhao Abhiyan'. 20% Tuition fee waiver is given to the wards of Defence and the Para-military Personnel. The University extends every support to students for applying, verification of the documents and assistance in applying for the Scholarship Programmes.

Sanskriti University (SU) has taken steps in this direction as part of its continuous improvement in the provision of high-quality education by providing high-quality programmes and incorporating the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) into its academic curriculum. CBCS also helps students in consultation with the Faculty Advisors to create their individualized academic plan (Mentors). The mentors help students select courses based on curriculum requirements, course requirements, the abilities of students and their interest in academic disciplines on Efficiency, Versatility and Analysis for enhancing their employment skills. In each semester, Inter-Disciplinary Tasks have been assigned to all students, regardless of their schools/programmes, in order to prepare them better to meet the challenges and demands of the real world. The
		programmes, in order to prepare them better to meet the challenges and demands of the real world. The interdisciplinary programs seek to improve the skill sets of students such as critical thinking, communication, soft skills, teamwork, analysis, etc. It aims to improve the knowledge and awareness of a student of (i) the interdisciplinary essence of knowledge and learning (ii) the importance and value of combining knowledge and insights from different disciplines as a means of assessing and understanding complex subjects, issues, problems, phenomena and events and (iii) skills gained during the educational process and to apply these to solve real-time problems. The criteria for the degree are defined in the form of minimum qualifying credits that must be earned by a student to receive a degree. Students have the opportunity to opt. for inter-disciplinary programmes viz. B.A.

		The assessment consists of both theory and practical assessment. Annexure A-5
5.8	What methods of evaluation of answer scripts does the University follow? Whether external experts are invited for evaluation?	The Semester End examinations are conducted under the supervision of the Controller of Examinations (COE). External / Senior Internal faculty moderates the question papers prepared by a combination of internal and external experts. The answer scripts are coded before evaluation.
		The answer scripts are evaluated by the External Experts and Internal faculty. After the answer sheets are evaluated, the re-checking is done by Scrutineers to ensure that the there is no counting mistake and no question is left unmarked. On the completion of the scrutiny, the marks are finalized and the Marks award List is prepared.
		The weightage of all components of internal assessment shall be 50% and Semester End Examination (SEE) shall carry weightage of 50%.
		The result is displayed on ERP. If the student wants to apply for re-checking, the students are provided the details regarding the process.
		The criteria for the degree are defined in the form of minimum qualifying credits that must be obtained by a student to receive a degree.
5.9	Mention the number of malpractice cases reported during the last 3 years and how they are dealt with.	The cases of students indulging in copying or any malpractice in any of the exams, are referred to the Unfair Means Committee to deal with the matter. The committee, after investigating into the case, recommends penalty on case by case basis.
		The University has developed a fool proof system to check the malpractices in Examinations. The various steps include:
		a) Seating arrangement of the students during the conduct of Examination is kept in such a way that no two students of the same papers sit together.b) A multi tier level of superintendence is maintained during the period of Examinations:

- 1st: For every 20 students one Invigilator is appointed. Faculty not below the level of Lecturer/Assistant Professor is appointed as Invigilator.
- Senior Faculty/HODs members are appointed as Exam supdt. and associated with Flying Squads.
